

## PARKHILL PRIMARY SCHOOL

### POLICY: WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK POLICY

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#### RATIONALE

The *Working With Children Act (2005)* defines minimum checking standards across Victoria for people who work or volunteer with children. The Purpose of the act is to “to assist in protecting children from sexual or physical harm by ensuring that people who work with, or care for, them have their suitability to do so checked by a government body”.

#### AIMS

1. To do our utmost to ensure the safety of all children.
2. To maintain high standards of professional conduct.
3. To meet our legislative obligations under the Working with Children Act (2005).

#### IMPLEMENTATION

- Anyone who works or volunteers a Victorian Government School is required to hold a WWCC unless they are exempt from having one in line with DEECD guidelines.
- **Working or Volunteering** under the act includes the following: “*Educational Services, Coaching or tuition services, Counselling or other support services for children, Overnight camps for children, and clubs, associations or movements (including of a cultural, recreational or sporting nature) that provide services or conduct activities for, or directed at, children or whose membership is mainly comprised of children*”<sup>1</sup>.
- The Department (DEECD) requires all staff and volunteers to hold a WWCC unless they are in an “exempt Occupation”. Parkhill will meet the Departments standards. (See “Exemptions” below).
- All Parkhill volunteers and staff who are required to have a WWCC must nominate Parkhill Primary School as an organisation in the “Organisation Details” section of their WWCC application form or update the organisation Details of their existing WWCC within “21 days of commencing child related work”<sup>1</sup> at Parkhill.
- Volunteers and staff should show their WWCC to the school office once their card is received and be able to produce their card at any time whilst working with children at Parkhill.
- The school will regularly check the status of staff and volunteer WWCCs at <https://online.justice.vic.gov.au/wwccu/checkstatus.doj>
- Volunteers and staff are not permitted to work at the school in any capacity if their WWCC is suspended or if they have received a WWCC Negative Notice. They may recommence work once they have successfully obtained a new/re-instated satisfactory WWCC.
- At Parkhill we require staff and volunteers hold a valid WWCC if they: attend school camps, supervise groups on excursions, coach sports teams/groups, run lunchtime clubs, supervise groups of children at official school functions and events (e.g. school disco, sporting and swimming carnivals, etc.).
- At Parkhill we require all staff (e.g. aids, administrators, cleaners, instrumental music teachers, etc.) and visiting specialists (e.g. SSO’s Speech Pathologists, Occupational Therapists, Psychologists, etc.) to have a WWCC.
- At Parkhill we require all Student teachers on practical teaching rounds and internships need to have a WWCC.
- **Exemptions:** Some people are exempt from needing a WWCC. This is usually because they have other forms of ongoing regular criminal record checks as part of their occupation that are deemed more stringent or consistent with a WWCC. The Department lists Exemptions as: “Registered “*Teachers*” (i.e. those who hold current Victorian Institute of Teaching (VIT) Registration<sup>4</sup>); Victoria “*Police officers*”<sup>5</sup> and “*Federal Police Officers*” who are not suspended from duty;
- The Principal may require a prospective employee or volunteer to undergo a National Police Record Check<sup>6</sup> in addition to holding a WWCC if he/she deems it appropriate to the responsibilities of their work (e.g. financial responsibilities).
- School Councillors, PFA Executives, and Parent Class Reps are required by the Department (DEECD) to obtain a WWCC.

#### EVALUATION

This policy will be reviewed as part of Parkhill Primary School’s four year review cycle.
